Empire of Dust

Theme: Empire of Dust (A Documentary Film, 77 Minutes)

The documentary Empire of Dust explores the fraught relationship between the Congolese and the Chinese, as shown through their efforts to build a road between two major cities in the DRC. The film explains the implication of the China-Congo deal, the future of the DRC moving forward and a day-to-today account of globalization at work.

The Storyline of the Film (Content)

The film focuses on two employees of the China Railway Engineering Company (CREC): Lao Yang, the company's Head of Logistics; and Eddy, his Congolese translator. The two visit construction sites around the country, overseeing a project marred by cultural misunderstandings.

The vast wilderness of the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC) is a world away from the urban centers of China. Yet it is there that greater numbers of Chinese engineers are doing business. In 2007, China and Congo signed a massive resources-for-infrastructure deal with projected revenues of \$40-\$120 billion. China endeavors to take on a wide range of development projects (including roads, hospitals, schools and airports) to be paid for by Congo's immense copper and cobalt reserves. Though a promising deal for the Congolese—the majority of whom live on less than \$1.25 a day—the deal's lack of transparency has made it the subject of scrutiny for human rights organizations..
